Introduction

solid waste management has a serious effect on our health, environment and contributes to climate change. In Tanzania, 37% of waste generated is estimated to be buried, 31% of waste is dumped and another 23% of waste is being burnt. Only 5% of the waste is regularly collected, 3% is irregularly collected and 1% is dumped by the road side. Therefore, mismanaged waste contributes to flooding as it ends up in the rivers and blocks storm drains. (National Bureau of Statistics Tanzania – 2012).

End of the month cleanup is the continuous national campaign to promote cleanliness and environmental education among Tanzanian community. The goal of this campaign is to initiate positive change both locally and nationally, working towards a clean, healthy, wastefree country.





PROJECT IMPACTS

- More than 300 people showed up during the beach cleanup event. These people were
 from different areas such as Mbezi beach neighborhood, government sector, private
 sector and Environmental conservation organizations. This event got much attention and
 attracted more people to come as it was end of the month cleanup as part of Dar city
 continuous campaign for cleaning and also this event was attended by Kinondoni district
 commissioner Mr Godwin Gondwe.
- Collected more 2000 tones of waste during the beach cleanup activity and all waste collected were transported to the landfill and all the recyclable waste were sent to the recycling companies.
- Awareness raising to the beach cleanup participants Before the cleanup starts we have a tendency of briefing the participants of dos and don'ts during the cleanup activities as part of our capacity building for people regarding the importance of beach cleanups and how it's done. Therefore, regarding our last beach cleanup event, we had the opportunity to share the knowledge on marine conservation issues and effective community engagement on beach cleanup activities and other environmental conservation issues.
- Certificate of Appreciation- ECCT together with all beach cleanup organizers (Kidmbwi beach and Mbezi beach B' subward) we received the certificate of appreciation and recognition from Kinondoni Municipality councils for our incredible works in environmental conservation in Dar es salaam.
